Welcome to the third Newsletter of the "**Open and Distance Education for Palliative Care at Home**" project (e-Care). In this newsletter we have included information about the 3<sup>rd</sup> Transnational Project Meeting and about the plans for next activities within the project.

### 3<sup>rd</sup> Transnational Project Meeting in Bitonto, Italy

On December 2-3, 2021, the third Transnational Meeting of the E-CARE project partners took place. The event was prepared in a hybrid form. Sinergia società cooperativa sociale (Italy) was visited by the following partner institutions: Kırklareli University (Turkey, project coordinator), the University of Çanakkale Onsekiz (Turkey), Ankara Aile ve Sosyal Hizmetler İl Müdürlüğü (Turkey), WYZSZA SZKOLA EKONOMII I INNOWACJI W LUBLINIE (Poland), MUNICIPIUL FAGARAS (Romania) and the "Marie Curie Association" Branch Smolyan (MCA) (Bulgaria); APEC Eğitim Danışmanlık Ltd. (Turkey) attended the online meeting via the Google MEET streaming platform.

The two-day meeting started with presentations summarizing the activities undertaken from the previous transnational partners meeting by each partner. KLU then presented the Intellectual Output 3, the **Moodle Platform for Palliative care e-learning course**, with its functions for the user and the Demo of Training Module 1.



The project leader presented also the first **Educational Video** recorded in collaboration with APEC. The consortium discussed the plans for the development of these educational tools for each Training module in English and in the partners languages. The rest of the meeting participants shared their opinion on it and their ideas for the **piloting** that will involve 5 family caregivers and 5 professional caregivers in each country.



In addition, partners raised such project topics as dissemination, online training evaluation and certification, setting the next dates of work and a plan for dissemination of the project results.

During the meeting, the additional module "The Implications of COVID-19 in the context of Palliative Care" was also presented to the partners.
